After successfully integrating our learnings from the conference held in Sydney in 2019, the ITP team presented their research findings at the International Society on Early Intervention (ISEI) Conference held in Chicago from 27 September to 30 September 2022. The team shared how DSA's Infant Toddler Program was vital to the progress of Singapore's Early Intervention service landscape to over 1,500 delegates representing countries from across the globe.

The plenary talks followed by the parallel sessions were organised to ensure all participants had a fruitful and insightful experience. Whilst some sessions were more interactive than others, the event presented us with the opportunity to network and find out more about on-going projects in other faculties or institutions and meet researchers, academics, and teachers from all around the world.

Our students in the Early Childhood Development Centres (ECDC) enrolled in our programs when they were as young as 5 years old. Many of these ECDCs have been very welcoming and supportive to our students and IFSP teachers. We collaborate and work with the teachers and parents to come up with common goals addressing mastering essential skills. We focus on fine and

gross motor skills, self-adaptive skills, social skills and literacy and numeracy skills, and provide inclass support where we will be in the classroom with our students facilitating their daily tasks and maintaining their good behaviour during class time. We also engage in 1-to-1 intervention where we focus on developing and strengthening the essential skills across various domains. We break down tasks and concepts into doable steps for our students so that they can gradually progress. We acknowledge and celebrate small wins with our students so that they will enjoy the learning process.

- Display competence through role-playing



FSS Webinar Fest

FSS organised a series of informative webinars with experienced occupational therapists from KidzOTC in October 2022.

1. Behaviour Management Strategies for persons with Down syndrome (1 October 2022)

Stress, family conflicts or neurological differences are some possible reasons that result in behavioural problems for individuals with Down syndrome. These may impact one's ability to self-regulate, express themselves, learn or navigate through daily situations. Ms. Inthumathi Subramanian dived deep into the possible underlying factors of these behavioural problems, sharing strategies and tips with caregivers to support positive behaviour change.

2. An Overview of Neurodevelopmental Techniques for Feeding (8 October 2022)

Children with Down syndrome often meet with feeding difficulties like stuffing their mouths and swallowing larger amounts of food without chewing. Mr. Chester Santiago introduced Neurodevelopmental Techniques (NDT) which could improve the feeding function and eating journey. He also discussed the complexity of feeding and shared tips on how to tackle the problem.

3. Optimising Visual Efficiency, Spatial Ability, and Information Processing (29 October 2022)

During the webinar, Mr. Alvin Chan provided participants with insights on developmental requisite capacities for the development of visual efficiency and visual information processing skills in individuals with Down syndrome. This enabled participants to provide early and effective pre-emptive intervention strategies to assist with the inevitable challenges.

We hope that these webinars provided our caregivers with insights to better care for their children, and we look forward to bringing more of such informative sessions in 2023.




'Harpy Hearts!'
