Among our members in DSA, there are many stories of resilience, determination, and triumph. In this issue of DSA News, we are glad to with you the inspiring stories of two of our young extraordinary members, Zanna Sim and Elliot Chee.

Zanna and Elliot enrolled into Infant Toddler Programme (ITP) and began their journey with DSA at the tender age of just three weeks. ITP provided specialist support designed to nurture the cognitive and social development of children from birth to four years old. The programme started in 2017 and has since been re-developed into the current Early Start Programme (ESP) with enhanced trans-disciplinary specialist support and early intervention for children from birth to 4 years old.

Guided by dedicated early intervention teachers and therapists from DSA's ITP team, Zanna and Elliot flourished and achieved various developmental milestones. Their early development laid a sturdy foundation for their future development, growth and achievements in life.

Upon graduating from the programme, they seamlessly transitioned into mainstream Early Childhood Development Centres, where they continued to learn, play, and grow.

DSA continued to support their development and educational pursuits through the Integration Facilitation Support Programme (IFSP). IFSP recognises that every child with Down syndrome deserves individualised assistance to maximise their potential. Our IFSP teachers collaborated closely with Zanna and Elliot's parents and childcare teachers, and provided ongoing specialist support to ensure that they get the necessary support to succeed.





- **Prenatal Support**
Support and information for parents expecting a child with Down syndrome.
- **Early Start Programme**
Transdisciplinary support to maximise the early social and cognitive development of children from birth to 4 years old to lay a strong foundation for lifelong learning and development.
- **Integration Facilitation Support Programme (IFSP)**
Integrated support for children ages of 3 to 14 years to support their learning and educational success in mainstream education settings.
- **Education Enhancement Programme**
Workshops for caregivers, teachers and other professionals to enhance their capability in supporting children with Down syndrome and other special needs.

 Dental health is another crucial aspect of the overall well-being of individuals with Down syndrome, who often face unique challenges in accessing dental services. Recognising this need, our collaboration with Mount Alvernia Clinic extends to improving dental care accessibility and awareness.

Basic Health Screening (Upcoming in July 2024!)
